During the year, students will learn the research mission science through participating in classroom activities, following mission blogs, talking with scientists at Palmer Station, Antarctica, through Live Video Broadcasts, meeting the research scientists, and presenting their own research at a spring Student Research Symposium. Teachers will participate in a summer workshop to learn about the science and project.
