This is an encyclopedia set somewhat like a dictionary. Includes plants, animals, and terms relating to aquatic life. Covers both fresh and salt water. Very comprehensive.

The Audubon Society Field Guide to North American Seashore Creatures. NY: Random House, 1981.

Biomes of the World. Danbury, CT: Grolier Educational, 1999. 9 volumes. Grades 5+

This set is a topical approach to biomes (ecological region), and includes polar regions, deserts, oceans, wetlands, mountains, temperate forests, tropical forests, temperate grassland, tropical grassland.

Exploring Life Science. Tarrytown, NY: Marshall Cavendish, 2000. 11 volumes. Grades 5+.

This is an encyclopedia set that is dictionary style. Topics include anything to do with the life sciences.

Library of the Oceans. Danbury, CT: Marshall Cavendish, 1998. 12 volumes. Grades 5+

Marshall Cavendish International Wildlife Encyclopedia. NY: Marshall Cavendish, 1990. 25 volumes. Grades 5+

This is the most comprehensive animal encyclopedia set for children on the market. It can be used for grades 5 and up, but be aware that some  $5^{th}$  graders may have difficulty with the text.

Anything and everything you wanted to know about sharks. This is a most comprehensive book. Challenging text.

Wildlife of the World. NY: Marshall Cavendish, 1994. 13 volumes. Grades 3+

This set devotes a two-page spread to each animal it covers. It is a little harder in reading level than <u>Amazing Animals of the World</u>. Includes photographs, map of habitat range, and a key facts bar.
